When students know how sentences are structured, they can write and speak with greater confidence and accuracy. Explicit teaching of language structures, like grammar, also can help students to make sense of complex texts.

Curriculum News

Learning Specialist - Numeracy

Term 3 has been a busy and exciting time for Mathematics across the school.

Our high-achieving students in Years 3 to 6 had the opportunity to take part in the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC). First run in 1978, the AMC is Australia's longest running, largest and most well-known maths competition for school students. Each year, the competition presents unique problems designed by leading educators and academics to challenge and extend students' problem-solving skills. We look forward to celebrating their results in Term 4.

Our Maths Fluency Program also continues to run each day after lunch for 15 minutes. The program is designed to build confidence and efficiency with foundational number skills, and it is gaining attention beyond our school. Last week, numeracy leaders from across the Beachside Network visited to see the program in action.

For students who may find Mathematics more challenging, we provide additional support through our Tutoring Program and Early Bird Maths Program, run by Mrs Bach and Mrs Ralph. Our Early Bird students have shown wonderful progress this term and are to be congratulated for developing a positive growth mindset around numeracy.



Learning Specialist - Literacy



Our work in the Literacy space has continued to focus on building strong foundations in phonics and spelling across all year levels.

In Foundation to Year 2, students take part in daily structured phonics sessions. These sessions focus on developing knowledge of letter–sound relationships, blending sounds to build words, and strengthening early spelling skills. Through consistent and explicit teaching, students are becoming more confident readers and writers as they apply their growing phonics knowledge in their literacy learning.

In Years 3 to 6, spelling instruction continues to be guided by our work with consultant Mardi Gorman. Students are learning to apply the five spelling strategies – sound, visual, meaning, connecting and checking – to strengthen their spelling accuracy and confidence. This learning is delivered within a consistent six-day routine, giving students the opportunity to explore, practise and apply strategies in a structured and purposeful way. Our work with Mardi will also continue this year as we refine and strengthen our whole-school spelling practices.

We are proud of the progress students are making and the enthusiasm they bring to their phonics and spelling lessons. These skills are essential building blocks for success in reading and writing, and we look forward to seeing students continue to flourish.







Community Helper Visits

Little Learners, Big Heros!

This term, our Prep students have been exploring their Inquiry unit "Keeping Safe and Healthy." As part of this learning, students have been investigating the important roles of community helpers and the ways they keep us safe.

We were lucky to have visits from our local firefighters and police officers, who spoke with the students about the different ways they help in our community. Students were very excited to learn about the important work they do every day, as well as explore the fire truck and police car up close. These hands-on experiences really brought learning to life and sparked lots of curiosity and discussion.

We are also looking forward to welcoming the SES (State Emergency Service) next week to continue building our understanding of how community helpers support us in times of need.

To complement this learning, our Prep students have been busy writing their own information reports about community helpers. This has been a fantastic opportunity for them to practise organising facts and sharing their knowledge through writing.

We look forward to sharing more highlights and student learning from these special visits at the conclusion of the unit.







Science Week

Last Friday, students took part in a special Science afternoon led by their classroom teachers, exploring this year's National Science Week theme: "Decoding the Universe – Exploring the Unknown with Nature's Hidden Language." It was fantastic to see each class embrace the theme in creative and engaging ways. Some highlights included:

- Year 2 investigated star constellations and their connections to Aboriginal Dreamtime stories.
- Year 5 discovered how nebulas are formed, then created their own colourful versions in glass jars.
- Year 6 explored communication through light, experimenting with a torch in a Morse code–style activity.

The afternoon was a wonderful celebration of science, curiosity, and discovery!






















