The additional resources made available through the significant new funding directed to this program provide us with an unprecedented opportunity to meet the learning needs of our students.

Students selected for this initiative will be based on the end year 2020 data. The parents of students deemed requiring the additional support will receive a consent form for their child to participate next week.

COVIDSafe

While it is wonderful news that we returned to on-site learning from day one this year, we will all remain vigilant in maintaining a COVIDSafe environment. Actions such as staying home when unwell, performing regular hand hygiene, wearing a mask when required and maintaining adult physical distance are simple measures, but are of the utmost importance.

That said, it is exciting to once again allow all students and staff to experience the full richness of school. Especially important are going to be those aspects that were so difficult to maintain through last year, including participation in arts, sport, practical activities in STEAM, school assemblies, and camps and excursions.

We learnt a lot about what we are capable of last year, as Parktone staff, students and parent successfully innovated and adapted like never before. The lessons learned from 2020, will stand us in great stead for the year ahead.

Parents are finally welcome onsite to say hello but DET advises that, due to ongoing COVID restrictions parents are unable to remain for longer than 15 minutes, unless officially signed in for contact tracing purposes. Please consider the amazing progress the children made last year in terms of independence and consider continuing with the 'Kiss and Go' option at Robert and Mc Swain Street or entering/departing the school grounds independently using the gates used in 2020.

There will always be a staff member on duty (8:45-9:00am and 3:30-3:45pm) to assist your child if needs be. Please note the school gates are opened at 8:40am for entry and closed at 3:45pm. During the school day the gates are locked at all times.

Student Leadership

On Monday we welcome MP Tim Richardson onto the school site to present our 2021 student leaders with their leadership badges. Parents of these students will also be able to be present at the assembly for the presentation.

Due to current COVID requirements we are unable to have our assemblies in the stadium with parents attending. We hope that soon parents will once again be able to enjoy this experience. Until then parents can view the assembly online which is posted at the end of the school day on Monday. This year assemblies will be conducted on Monday at 9:00am. The school day commences at 8:50am on Monday so please remind your child to go directly to their classroom to commence their days learning. On the other days students are able to enter their classroom at 8:50am to unpack their school bag with the formal roll being taken at 9:00am.

Please note, that it is imperative that your child is at school by 9:00am. Those students who arrive late, miss the introduction of the lesson which makes it unsettling for all, peers, teacher and the student late. This is also the case when students leave prior to the 3:30 pm bell. So let us all make a conscience effort to arrive and leave school at the correct times in 2021.

Building Project

As you know we have been successful in receiving funding from the Victorian Government. Already several meetings have been held. On Monday the architects will visit Parktone to get a sense of the space and our vision. We will be putting regular updates about this throughout the year.

Face Masks

Following the Government's announcements regarding new statewide restrictions that came into effect at 11:59pm on Wednesday 3 February, there is new guidance for schools regarding the wearing of masks. People aged 12 and over must wear a fitted face mask when in public indoor spaces unless there is a lawful reason not to.

Students aged 12 or older must wear a face mask indoors when at school, unless they are attending a primary school, an Outside school hours care (OHSC) program or an exception applies.

Children under 12 years of age and students at primary school or attending an OHSC program are not required to wear face masks.

School staff are not required to wear face masks while teaching or caring, but those who wish to do so, can. Staff must wear face masks in indoor areas of the school when not teaching or caring.

Visitors to school sites must also wear masks when indoors.

Mobile phones/smart watches

In accordance with the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#) issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Parktone Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones and similar devices owned by students at Parktone Primary school are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Parktone Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Please refer to Parktone Primary School's Personal Property Policy.

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Parktone Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Parktone Primary School, mobile phones will be collected at the commencement of the school day by a designated teacher. Mobile phones will be signed in by the teacher and student. The same procedure will happen at the end of the day with mobile phones being signed out. Students who use smart watches or similar devices must ensure it on flight mode during school hours.

Students who are found to using these inappropriately during school hours will have them confiscated and stored in secure storage as per the mobile phones.

Inclusion Lounge

This week the students have had a class visit to the Inclusion Lounge to check out what great resources are available to them. For children to access the indoor space during recess and lunch times they will require an entry card which is given by either a class or yard duty teacher. It is great to see the Inclusion Lounge operating at the start of next week.

Welcome to our 2021 Preps

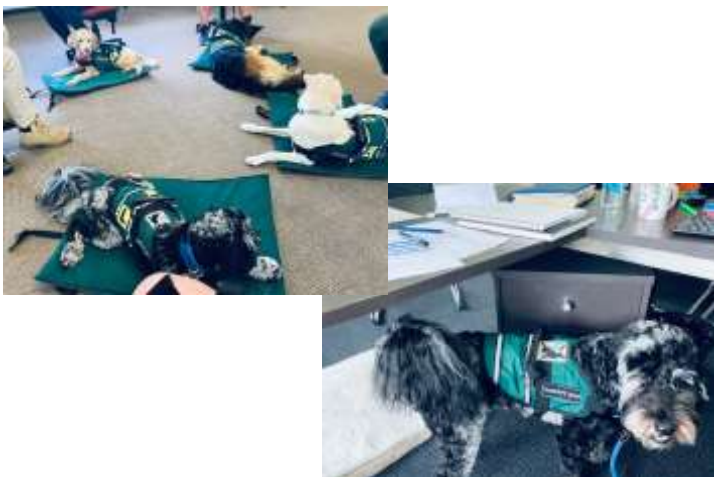

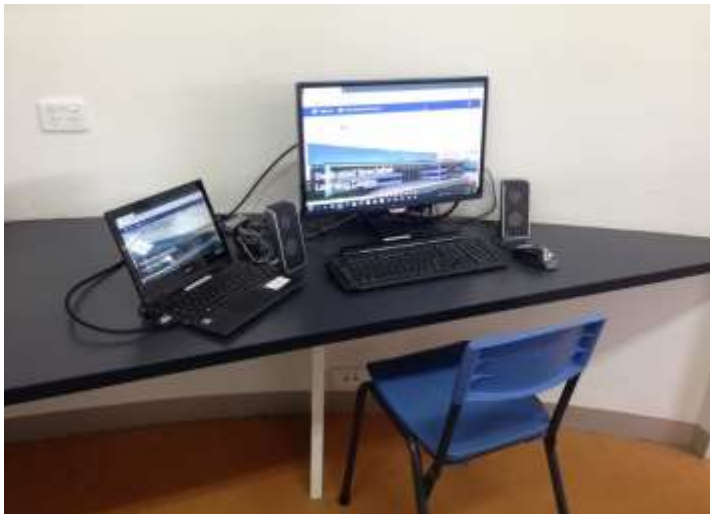

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS - INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

WHO IS ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

For most primary school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected school employee category – members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional community member category – members are coopted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. Councilors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term one each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

A small number of school councils have Nominee members.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, with two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election.

You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

REMEMBER

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.

The Kiss & Go program is an initiative to help improve the road safety of children and traffic congestion around the school.

The Kiss & Go program:

- The Kiss & Go program is designed to provide families with a safe and convenient area for dropping off and picking up children.
- Is a short term stopping area for children to be able to walk between the car and the school using the safety of the footpath.
- Is controlled by the regulatory street signs and is enforced by Kingston City Council.

The Kiss & Go Zone

- The Kiss & Go zone is a short term stopping area where drivers are allowed to stop and park the vehicle for a short time – no longer than two minutes – while the student exits or enters the vehicle from the kerbside doors. This enables students to walk between the car and the school, using the safety of the footpath.
- The zone operates during peak periods allowing parents to park their vehicles for up to two minutes outside the school gates
- This area is not a parking space and fines and demerit points apply if the driver leaves the vehicle unattended longer than 2 minutes and no more than 3 metres away.

THE KISS & GO ZONE IS A BENEFIT FOR ALL.

HOW TO SAFELY USE THE KISS & GO ZONE

UNDERSTANDING THE RULES

Kiss & Go zones are for your child's safety, your convenience and to minimise congestion and confusion.

Kiss & Go rules

- The Kiss & Go zones operates under the same conditions as 'No Parking' zones. You may stop in this area for up to 2 minutes to drop off or pick up children.
- The driver may not leave the vehicle unattended. This means no more than 3 metres away from the vehicle.
- This zone applies only during the hours of operation as indicated on the sign.



Remember

- **Do not leave your vehicle**
To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.
- **Be timely**
If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.
- **Child safety**
Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.
- **Stay in sequence**
Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.
- **Driver duty of care**
Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.
- **No U-turns**
Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk.



Please do not stop the car until you reach the top of the queue. This helps other cars arriving behind you and shares the zone in the safest way.

Continue along Blackwood Ave until turning left on to Broome Ave. Continue then cross over Broome Ave on to Coolabah St. Turn left on Lower Dandenong Rd. Use the pedestrian operated lights to cross over and head down Ivy St (on the west or left side). Turn left on Robert St and continue to the school entry.

orange route

Park and stride from Mentone Racecourse Reserve. Travel down Glenelg Rd → left on Lower Dandenong Rd. Use the pedestrian operated lights to cross over and head down Ivy St (on the west or left side). Turn left on Robert St and continue to the school entry.

🕒 22 minute walk (1.4kms)

green route

Park and stride from Duggan Street Reserve. Head along Scarlet St → Warren Rd. Use the pedestrian operated lights at the crossing near Parkdale Secondary College. Cross over Warren Rd and then head to Clare St. Continue all the way along → turn right on to McSwain St. Use the school crossing just after Grey St for entry to the school.

🕒 20 minute walk (1.3kms)

blue route

Park and stride from Walter Galt Reserve → along reserve footpath. Stay on the west side of the footpath (left) as heading down McSwain St. Arrive at the school.

🕒 5-7 minute walk (530m)
