Japanese Study Tour

Curriculum Day

On 29th April, we held a pupil-free Curriculum Day so our teachers could work with one of Australia's leading educational consultants, Glen Pearsall.

The focus of the day was to support teachers in building an effective toolkit for creating and maintaining positive and dynamic classrooms. We explored a range of practical responses to students who are 'off task', with strategies ranging from subtle, low-key reminders through to more overt directives.

The strategies explored included:

- Low-key interventions - quick techniques for subtly encouraging students to remain on task
- Giving explicit instruction - using brief verbal interventions to remind students of expectations
- The use of low-demand instructions - using declarative language to support students who are demand-avoidant
- Developing the art of pivoting - using scripts to avoid arguments and redirect students back to their learning

Teachers found the day invaluable in strengthening their teaching practice and have since implemented these strategies within their classrooms.

Literacy at Parktone

This term in Literacy, students have been exploring the structure and features of informative texts through engaging mentor texts connected to their learning in Biological Sciences.

Our Year 3 mentor text was *The Wonderful Wisdom of Ants* while Year 6 explored *The Book of Bees*, to investigate how authors organise and present factual information. Through patterned writing activities, students identified key language features, text structures and sentence patterns before applying these skills to create their own informative reports about living creatures.

After publishing, students are looking forward to sharing their reports with one another across the year levels, with Year 3 and Year 6 students coming together to celebrate their learning!

In our Prep–2 learning spaces, students continue to engage in daily explicit phonics sessions to build strong foundational reading and spelling skills.

Our Prep students have been learning to transfer their knowledge of letter sounds to decode and read new words and also encode and spell words with growing confidence.

We are so proud of our awesome Preps and the enthusiasm they bring to their learning each day!



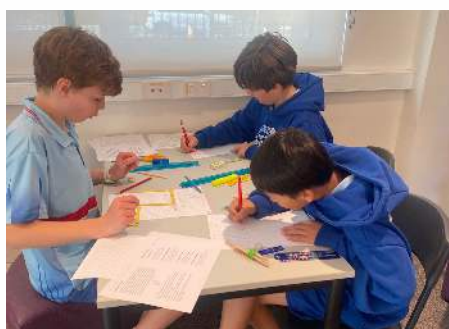
Students Rise to the Maths Challenge

Selected students participated in the 2026 Maths Challenge, a national problem-solving program organised by the Australian Maths Trust for students in Years 3 to 6 with a strong interest in mathematics.

Across four sessions in Term 2, students will work on a series of challenging mathematical problems designed to develop persistence, logical reasoning, and creative thinking skills. Students synergise with peers and discuss strategies and ideas while independently completing their own written solutions.

The program provides students with an engaging opportunity to extend their mathematical thinking beyond the classroom and further develop their confidence and problem-solving abilities. Students' results were submitted to the Australian Maths Trust, with certificates awarded across a range of achievement levels.

Learning Under the Stars

To support the Year 1 and Year 3 Science and Inquiry units, students explored the weather, seasons, the sky, and sustainability on Planet Earth. Throughout the unit, they observed patterns in daily and seasonal weather, as well as the movements of the Sun, Moon, and stars. Students also investigated ways humans can care for water, land, and air, and learned about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander knowledge of seasonal changes and sky patterns, including how this knowledge has helped communities live sustainably for generations.

As part of this learning, students participated in an exciting incursion presented by Starlab Victoria. During the session, students took part in a guided lesson delivered by a qualified science professional inside an inflatable planetarium dome. The incursion connected closely with the current Inquiry Unit and supported the achievement of key curriculum outcomes.



Learning Under the Sea

Our Year 4 students had the exciting opportunity to participate in an excursion to SEA LIFE Melbourne Aquarium. The excursion provided students with a valuable hands-on learning experience that supported their Inquiry unit, Web of Life.

Throughout the visit, students explored a range of fascinating marine environments and discovered the many ways living things are connected within ecosystems. They observed a variety of sea creatures up close, including sharks, rays, jellyfish, penguins, and tropical fish, while learning about habitats, food chains, and the importance of biodiversity.

The excursion encouraged students to think about how plants, animals, and humans rely on one another to survive and thrive. Students also learned about conservation efforts and the ways people can help protect oceans and marine life for future generations.

This engaging experience helped bring classroom learning to life and sparked curiosity and excitement as students prepared to begin their Web of Life Inquiry unit.
